We are all aware of the outbreak of the new coronavirus (2019-nCoV) in China, particularly in Wuhan city and Hubei province. Recent updates have shown that infections are now on the rise on a worldwide scale [1], with an increasing number of cases in certain parts of Europe. Realizing that 2019-nCoV is starting to knock on our doors, we decided to publish this letter from Dr. Zhang and colleagues because it clearly and concisely summarizes important measures that need to be taken to prevent 2019-nCoV transmission in a hospital setting.
